Bar Patio Air Is Unhealthy

Secondhand Smoke



8 out of **14** bar patios had peak air quality readings in EPA "Unhealthy" range or higher*


*1 bar had a voluntary no-smoking/vaping policy

Heavy smoking on bar patios can make air quality **worse than wildfire season**



Thirdhand Smoke

Thirdhand smoke is **residue from smoking and vaping** that settles on surfaces, floors, furniture, clothes, hair, and skin



5 out of 6 bar patios had nicotine residue levels as bad as homes with indoor smoking

4 out of **4**

non-smoking bar patrons had high levels of nicotine on their hands after spending 2 hours on bar patios

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
